ood evening to you all my brothers and sisters. Each year, for the last 19 years, BCBP members have gathered together to celebrate an important event in the life of BCBP, our anniversary. It is an event that many look forward to because it is a time of festivity, of joy, of renewing acquaintances, of meeting other brothers and sisters in community. Over these 19 years, I have had the pleasure and privilege of having attended 17 BCBP anniversaries and I must say that I have enjoyed each and every one of them immensely.

I remember having read in an article that "the chief end and duty of man is to love God and to enjoy him forever." How true can this statement be for even Scripture tells us that the joy of the Lord is our strength and also tells us that today is holy to the Lord for it is a day dedicated to Him. Thus, in Nehemiah 8:10, we read:

(Neh.8:10)

When I came across this scripture verse, I queried myself about its meaning and implication. Somehow I got the sense that celebration is central in our life, in our spiritual disciplines. That we cannot continue long in anything without the spirit of joy. In fact, I dare to state that the only reason we can begin anything we do, either as individuals or as a community is because we know that joy, our rejoicing in the Lord is the end result. This is what had sustained us in the BCBP for the last 19 years. We knew from the beginning of our existence that there is a sense of pleasure, of enjoyment, in everything that the Lord will bring before us. Without the joyful spirit of festivity, our disciplines become dull, death-breathing tools in the hand of modern Pharisees.

Today, here in Bacolod, which I acknowledge to be truly the City of Smiles I understand that we have in attendance more than one thousand three hundred BCBP-ers from all over the country. While this may be our biggest so far, it has also been our experience for the last five or so years that we, the experienced, the not-so-experienced and the new members of the BCBP encounter one another in a spirit that is full of excitement, of hope and great expectations during our national anniversary celebrations.

I was sad when I read in the Kapatiran an article written by our sister Nena Paras from Cagayan de Oro about
the "Lamantations of a Manila Girl" where she expressed in a rather straight forward manner
some of her disappointing experiences
during our anniversary last year.
As I reflected it dawned on
me that the Lord was

not only teaching us a lesson but ushering us into an understanding that feelings ... of joy or of sadness are not an end by themselves, but rather only a means to enhance our love for God and to build our strength in the Lord.

Not coincidentally, the Lord, had inspired our hosts, the BCBP Bacolod North and South Chapters to immediately address that experience with this year's anniversary theme: "THAT WE MAY ALL BE ONE" taken from John 17:21. In this Gospel account, Jesus entrusted us, his disciples, to the Father. Jesus knew the dangers that we were bound to face ... the world, the flesh and devil...temptations, fear, sorrow, and even division. Recognizing such perils, He now reminds us that oneness is a necessity if we are

to overcome the obstacles that tend to take us away from effectively pursuing that vision and mission that the Good Lord had entrusted to us. He tells us that we must be one heart and one mind, that we must be an encouragement to one another, indeed, we must be our brother's keeper.

In the book of Acts, we find many accounts where the believers even went to the extent of disposing their properties so that the proceeds could then be distributed to everyone according to need. No one claimed any of his possessions as his own, but they had every thing in common. I am not saying that we are called to do the same expression of sacrificial love, but rather to understand and appropriate to ourselves that UNITY . . . being a family, a precious gift of the Spirit that we must foster and cherish with all our hearts.

And unity. . oneness in the BCBP is a must if we are to collectively be diligent keepers of the vision and the mission entrusted to us for indeed Unity is strength, and if at this hour, you still have not added to your list of new friends, at least ten new acquaintances from the other chapters and outreaches, then you have failed to take advantage of the numerous opportunities available to you for this purpose of increasing our oneness.

The calling for us to be one is also made significant because our anniversary this year is the last for this century and we are all privileged to "... the be a part of yet another milestone. Our 19th year celebration is also our window to the coming third millennium, an era in the millenium hischallenges us to give our best... how

tory of mankind and of the BCBP that is veiled with uncertainties but definitely rich with great hope and expectations.

Next year, the beginning of the new millennium, has been declared by the Catholic Church as the Year of the Great Jubilee. In Lev.25:8ff, we find the great significance of the Year of the Jubilee, a year of new beginnings, of homecomings, of being clean or cleansed, of being honest, of being just, of being helpful, of freedom, of observing divine statutes and of faithful keeping of heavenly ordinances, of pursuing that which we have all been called to do. While it promises a rewarding year, it also challenges us to give our best, to look beyond our personal preferences, to get out of our comfort zones, to look not on ourselves or what we can get out of the BCBP or from the Lord, but to think of how much of ourselves we are willing to give in order to promote God's pur-



poses and to move towards establishing a truly united BCBP community in a radical way, and all because we are bound by a common love for God and of one another.

"That we may all be one" is not simply a wish or a prayer. It is a calling, in fact, a directive from the God most high for all of us to take the initiative in constantly seeking and pursuing the oneness - the unity that we are all called to. Neither distance nor time, nor culture, nor chapter, nor service should take us away from our predestined life ... oneness, unity with God through one another because He is our Father and we are His sons and daughters.

At this time allow me to acknowledge with much appreciation, the great service that our brothers and sisters here in Bacolod North and South Chapters, are giving to the Lord by making us all feel like one big family. Many have invested much of themselves to make this event not simply a successful undertaking, but rather a great offering of love to our Abba Father. Can we all give them a well deserved acknowledgement? May we now all ask everyone to stand up, except for our hosts, the BCBP Bacolod members, and give them a warm applause. At this time, may I ask everyone to extend their hands to the nearest brother or sister from Bacolod as we pray for them in appreciation and much are we willing to give?" gratitude and to ask the Lord to continue blessing their personal, family and community life.

BCBP 19th Anniversary ATTENDANCE BY CHAPTERS





rothers and sisters, I welcome you to the heart of the diocese of Bacolod and I'm just so happy. I come to the realization that God, our God, is a God of joy, He is a God of surprises and He is a God with a sense of humor. I have been to many

religious events here in the diocese of Bacolod and I see familiar faces. I have seen them in many, many ways...in different situations, but I never knew they were members of the BCBP. I could mention names but I'm sure I'd run out of time. I'm simply electrified being with you this evening, there are just so many of you! Our God is a God of surprises. When I was looking at your program, I could not help but see that this is the most unique convention. As you saw in the Gospel episode of today, this was the problem of the Jews. They had a mindset that was hard to change because they were dealing with visible and material things and realities. They were more concerned with externals, rituals and ceremonies. For them, those externals were more important than the meaning behind them. It is very hard to learn if our mind is closed. When one is so full of one's self, God simply cannot enter, God cannot work.

Sometimes we experience this reluctance, this resistance to change. We feel we are doing a good thing and the right thing. It is something we want to work for and do for God. But there is a big difference between working for God and doing God's will. This is very hard to learn if our minds are not open. The Holy Spirit is stifled and we know that St. Paul said, "Do not stifle the Holy Spirit." And so we pray for deep humility and openness, a constant openness to grow in the Spirit, to grow in the gift of wisdom. We pray for that gift of the Holy Spirit to strengthen our faith on a personal level.

again. At the end of the celebration, you find yourself "richer" with dozens of calling cards, confident that when you visit their provinces, you can visit new families and never feel you have ever left home.




From my vantage point, I'd like to share with you some of the "inside information" which I believe were vital

First of all, I honestly believe that the Bacolod people started on the right foot when they began their preparations by calling everyone to a nine-week novena of prayers. The headache was so severe that I could hardly move, if I did, I felt as if my head was splitting and falling off my neck. I felt helpless until I remembered to call the medical emergency numbers

She could only do so much for the pain and suggested that a physician prescribe a stronger medicine. Later Dr. Bonnie Avelino came and gave me some tablets to take. Ed and Amanda, while attending to their other assignments also saw to it that I'd be taken care of. They arranged for my food that night inside my room. And they, together with the anniversary secretariat appeared to have organized a "medical team" headed by Dr. Bonnie to attend to me. The house nurse checked on my condition a couple of times during the night. Ating Jochico called me twice or so to wish me well and assured me that the secretariat was praying over me from wherever they were at the time. And of course Ed and Amanda checked how I was feeling. Simply heartwarming.

The 19th National Anniversary Celebration was well organized, and my personal congratulations and gratitude go to all "Bacolodians." One comment I heard was that this celebration may be hard to duplicate. Personally, I'd say yes and no to that comment. BCBP Bacolods did their best and the result was fantastic. But we are not here to outdo one another. I'm sure that Bacolod had one thing in mind: to make this celebration the best they could all for the glory and honor of God. In the same breath I'd say that all of us, too have this same intention.

Rey Feria together with his Las Pinas BCBPers came prepared with what they intend to offer to the BCBP Country and more specifically to the Lord for the next anniversary in the year 2000. They may not equal or duplicate the 19th point for point, but I am certain that if it's intended and offered for the Lord, the 20th will just be as great. And perhaps just as Bacolod did, and to address the mandate of 19th anniversary theme, let's all together as one pray for Rey and his chapter so that we can together enjoy the next anniversary - a yearly celebration of God's victory through the BCBP!

ere we were — at the source, the underground spring that gives birth to a river and several lakes high in the mountains between Bais and Bacolod, between Neg. Oriental and Neg. Occidental. At the foot of a rocky wooded hill a concrete basin tried to contain the fresh, clear and abundant river of water that burst out of the depths of the volcanic mountain. The force of the basin's overflow was so strong that we found it almost impossible to sit under it and still breathe.

Small children frolicked in the sparkling water, farm women gathered along the banks to do their laundry and exchange family happenings, dragonflies darted over the water, butterflies hovered among the mossy rocks and grasses along the banks of the river. Downstream framed by a patch of rose-colored lotus blossoms

> enveloped in God's love and grace. His love caressed me in the flowing water; His beauty delighted my eyes in the dragonflies and butterflies, in the sun and shade, in the smiles of the children and the laughter of the women doing their washing. I am loved. So, too. must I love others.

Love is the beginning and the end of the way that leads to God. As Scripture proclaims, God is love: it is the Father who eternally generates his Son in the bond of personal love that is the Holy Spirit (God, the Father of Mercy, Official Catechetical Text). This divine love, a central mystery of Christianity, intends to be communicated to our hearts and to animate us. It is this divine love that is the power that gives the Church its life and structure. As St. Paul aptly emphasizes in 1 Cor. 13, nothing that we do

or are is worth anything without the abiding presence of Love in our hearts. When all is said and done, faith and hope are contained in love.

The Christian life has no other meaning and aim than love. If our faith is true and deep-rooted in the Truth, if the love we profess is authentic, it ought to transform the world and the persons who inhabit it — beginning with ourselves. Faith is empty, and hope vain, unless we experience the personal love of God in Jesus Christ and the Church.

In today's culture it is sometimes difficult to talk about love because each sector and segment of society has its own definition of "love". We have to admit that even with everyone seeking to define "love", "love" is still the greatest of all mysteries. Everyone wishes to be loved and to know that there is a meaning in his or her life. Even in the worst scenario: love must have been proclaimed and somehow defined - by its absence. This was the thrust of my focusing retreat, to simply refocus myself on the salvific love of God through the wonder of His creation.

To me, in the full sense, love implies a sharing in the very life of God. God loves us so much that He creates and renews a world of wonder

life-giving and abundant.

love? A nourishing love? An ever-present love ... abundantly given from my heart ... regardless of whether my expectations/desires from them are met? Do I love unconditionally?

Do I focus on the natural and unique beauty and

and unique beauty and goodness in others; do I accept them as they are, children of the One God, Who is their Father and my Father? Is my love a transforming love? A sharing love? A renewing love? In the process of reflection I felt hurt and sad at the opportunities to give love that I have by-passed and at the occasions to receive love that I have ignored or rejected. I realized that the conditions for love I had unknowingly constructed around me had defined the limits of my loving others and my ability to graciously accept love from others.

God reached out to me

through His creation, through the source of the water of the river and the lakes to show me and let me feel the healing grace and availability of His love. Water from the heart of the mountain flowed so abundantly, so unconditionally and gave so much life to everything it came into contact with,

transforming dry arid land into fertile, crop-bearing, life-nourishing land. And God, Who is Love, is like this water from the mountain's depths.

God is the Source. His love is the powerful stream of living water that supports all life ... always new and renewing, life-giving and abundant. It is eternally there for us to find and be refreshed. It is overflowing and comes from the depths of the Father-Heart of God. We can find ourselves enjoying its refreshing waters, or we can just sit on the bank of the river afraid to get wet. It is our choice.

In this Year of God the Father, we need to immerse ourselves and bathe in God's love. We need to nourish ourselves in the Source of All Love. His love must transform us and grow in us, through us and with us so that we, in turn, can share this love with others. Is my love sufficient for this great task of loving and sharing? Yes, it is ... as long as my love flows from the Source of All Love, from God the Father.

The Catechetical Text on God the Father says that "in becoming a human being, God joined the lot of the human being to his own, granting to that being a share in the endless divine

and end of all of the ways of the Lord,



From that moment forward, on earth as in heaven, no one can love God without loving the human being who is the divine image, nor love the human being without loving God." St. John explains this simply and clearly in his wonderful teaching on love in 1 John 4:7-21.

On the third day of our retreat we were directed to focus on the healing power of Transforming Love and Sharing Love as we savored the manifestations of God's presence and love in our life. The focus question was: What is the impact of God's love as seen in Creation in your life and, through you, in the lives of those around you?

I sat down at the side of the lake and reflected. Is my love of myself and for those around me an over-flowing love? A life-enhancing


