BAGUIO TEACHERS CAMP, a DepEd facility which celebrated its Centennial in 2008, provides an invigorating, cool, pine-laden vacation and recreation haven dotted with heritage cottages, halls, buildings and lodging places.

NAC Registration will be in ALBERT HALL, a spacious, heritage-style structure approached by a concrete stairway flanked by flower gardens. Below is a Plaza where the Fun Games will be held. ## President's Message

# "Do Not Be Afraid..."

Since the time when the Board of Trustees decided that I would be the next president of the BCBP, this has been God's recurring message to me. Like many of you who are taking on new leadership assignments, I had my fears, doubts and concerns. Was I ready for this big challenge? Would I be able to handle the frequent travel schedules visiting our brothers and sisters nationwide? Did I have the time? Am I spiritually mature enough to be able to lead others closer to God through the BCBP? What about family and business obligations, how would I be able to balance my priorities?

The readings during the nine days Misa de Gallo inspired me to reflect on Mary's "Yes!" Just imagine how we would be now if Mary had said "No." But angel Gabriel told her, "Do not be afraid..." So Mary said "Yes" despite the fact that she faced social ostracism and death by stoning if found pregnant outside the marriage bond. She said "Yes" not really knowing what would happen to her in the future, or what effect this would have on her life. She said "Yes" believing that God would make the impossible happen.

In all the readings the message "Do not be afraid" echoed strongly in my heart. During the angel's announcement to Zechariah that his wife Elizabeth would bear a son, called John, the angel's first words to Zechariah were, "Do not be afraid..." The angel Gabriel encouraged Mary with the words, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." When Joseph decided to divorce Mary quietly, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home."

As I reflected on Mary's "Yes" and the recurring message "Do not be afraid...", the passage in John 15 came to mind. Jesus repeats over and over: "Remain in Me... Whoever remains in Me and I in him will bear much fruit. ... If you remain in Me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. ... Remain in my love."

"Do not be afraid, remain in Me and my love." Yes, Lord, I accept the responsibility of the presidency of the BCBP, trusting in your promise that in all things, You work for good with those who love you, who answer your call for service (Rom 8:28). You, Lord, can make the impossible possible.

I have answered His call realizing that I am accountable for my service, not only to the whole BCBP membership, to all of you brothers and sisters, but most importantly, to the Lord. It is He who has entrusted me with his people in the BCBP. It is He who has tasked me with the servant-leadership of His community, the BCBP. Although this is a great challenge set before me, I believe that with your help, your encouragement, and your prayers, together we can strengthen and upbuild the BCBP in its Vision and Mission in the marketplace in new and marvelous ways, even as He has promised us.

# **Larry Veloso:** *Our Priorities for the Next Three Years*

*We interviewed President Larry Veloso after the first BOT-ManCom meeting of 2009, and asked him about the plans and programs that he would like to see accomplished during his 3-year term.*

**LV:** We would like to focus primarily on the formation of members, new as well as current members as well as the training of leaders. Full implementation of the New Basic Formation Program (NBFP) throughout all chapters and outreaches will be a definite priority. Together with this, we will need to conduct both Action Group Leaders' Training and a Speakers' Training, so that the talks in the NBFP will be properly delivered and followed up in the action groups in such a way as to impact on the incoming BCBP members. AGLs, although most have been BCBP members for some time, will also need to upgrade their knowledge and leadership skills in view of the BCBP's new Vision and Mission, as well as the new teaching talks

included in the NBFP format. We hope to implement a follow-up program for AGLs, too.

**KAP:** *You mentioned the training of leaders. What kind of training programs do you envision?*


**LV:** We in the national leadership have noticed that many chapters and outreaches seem to be having difficulty in selecting competent leaders for their respective governance teams. This is happening at all levels from Action Group Leaders, Unit Leaders, Governance Team all the way up to the Chapter Head. We believe that one way to be more proactive in this area of leadership selection is to implement a more structured and focused leadership training program, not

only to include skills training, but also to develop a greater degree of spiritual maturity in the prospective leaders. One of the training programs that I feel should be considered for leadership is the Steward Leaders Training, perhaps combined with some aspects of the Discipleship Workshop. The Scripture Discovery Weekend is another program that could be of help so that our leaders will be imbued with an enthusiasm for the Word of God and have the necessary skills to encourage their members to live the Word of God in their lives.

**KAP:** *Besides emphasis on formation and leadership training, what other priorities have you identified?*

**LV:** We are reviewing the BCBP Breakfast with the objective of reviving its basic purpose – to bring in first-timers and new breakfasters. It's time for going back to the basics and fully implementing the Breakfast guidelines. Since the Breakfast serves as the entry point and introduction to the BCBP, we need to be more aggressive in bringing in new prospective members, not just one or two breakfasts before the BCLP, but each and every breakfast should have a good number of new comers. Additionally, we need to check out the revised Vision and Mission and at the breakfast level, pinpoint those businessmen, women and professionals to invite to the Breakfast who will be able to bring Christ into their areas of influence in their respective marketplaces.

Another priority concern is the Caring for Members. This needs to be strengthened not only in terms of one member caring for another within the action group and chapter, but we



want to expand this caring system throughout the BCBP. For instance, if a member needs to be hospitalized in another city, then we would expect the BCBP members in that city to extend their support as a community to the hospitalized member. This could be in terms of pray-overs and just being there (prayer of presence), opening homes to family members who accompany the sick member, as well as in other forms of support when needed.

Improving our BCBP website to make it more attractive and functional for members and surfers is another area we will be looking into. Our target is to set up the BCBP Community Portal and have it operational in time for launching during the upcoming National Anniversary in April. In this regard, I urge all members to improve their computer skills to be able to make use of our BCBP website.

The next level consists of the Service Regions, each headed by an AMD with its respective Regional Council Directors (RCDs).

## *Back to Basics*

*The revised Vision and Mission of the BCBP was approved by the Board of Trustees and ManCom during their January 17, 2009, meeting. The following text on the BCBP Vision is part of the Talk/Teaching developed by Fr. Herb Schneider. Part 2 of this talk on the Mission of the BCBP will be included in the next issue of the KAPATIRAN.*

# **EXPLAINING OUR BCBP VISION**

**H**aving a goal in life, having a vision and mission, is most important to our fulfillment as human beings. What is true of individuals is also true of groups, communities, and nations. A person without a goal in life drifts and will ultimately find life meaningless. If this state continues, it may

lead to mental illness and despair. Proverbs tells us that a people without a vision perish.

James Callaghan a former prime minister of the United Kingdom said the following: "In my judgment, a leader should have a core philosophy and belief against which he can





judge the important issues as they arise.” He goes on to say that, if a person lacks that he or she won’t be able to survive the storms that blow up in life and the reason is, because that person lacks a secure anchor that can keep him steady in a time of confusion or darkness.

The BCBP, too, has a goal, a vision and mission that every member of the BCBP makes his or her own and that he lives for and works for. What makes our BCBP vision and mission so exciting is that we believe the Lord Jesus called us together to be in the BCBP and he himself gave us our vision and mission, i.e. our marching orders. With this in mind we want to take a close look at our vision.

**Our Vision:  
Bringing Christ into the marketplace  
and winning the marketplace for Christ.**

Our Vision consists of two equally important parts: (1) Bringing Christ into the marketplace and (2) winning the marketplace for Christ. Let us consider our vision in greater detail.

**Bringing Christ into the Marketplace**

Christ cannot be brought into the marketplace by putting him in an attaché case, carrying him to our office, and taking him along to our various business appointments. The only way Christ can be brought into the marketplace is through businessmen, who have made Christ their Lord, have enthroned him in their hearts, who are witnesses to the Lord to such a degree that they have become “alter Christus” (another Christ).

Thus the first part of our vision focuses on the work of evangelization of persons through whom Jesus Christ can enter the world of business and the professions. From this it follows that the BCBP is committed to evangelizing business people and professionals. We evangelize through our businessmen’s breakfasts, our BCLP, and our basic formation program. We also evangelize through our witnessing in the marketplace. People are convinced and evangelized not by mere words but more powerfully by the actions we make consistently with integrity.

We need to remember what Pope Paul VI taught in *Evangelii Nuntiandi*. Evangelization is not complete when we get a person to recommit his life to Jesus Christ and pray with him for Baptism in the Holy Spirit. Evangelization reaches its completion when that person is integrated into a Christian community, has been formed in the basics of Christian life and equipped to share in the mission of the Church through his community, which is in our case the BCBP. Thus only when people make their full commitment to the BCBP does their process of evangelization reach completion.

The second part of our vision spells out the target group for our evangelization and that is not just people who work in an office. We will explain who we are called to evangelize in more detail after we understand the second part of our vision.

### **Winning the Marketplace for Christ**

The second part of our vision focuses on the environment, the culture, the value system of the business and professions community. What we are dealing with is a culture, a total design for manufacturing and selling, trading, providing services, etc. This culture is expressed through the philosophy of capitalism, free enterprise, profit above all else, production at the lowest possible cost mostly at the expense of the ordinary employees. With respect to customers it is expressed in the "caveat emptor" let the buyer beware.

The Lord wants us to so impact the culture of the business world and that of the professions that the very value system will change to one of genuine and sustainable development for all, sharing the benefits of business with all the stakeholders including the little people. Making sure we do not make money by under-paying our staff or by hiring people and firing them before the six-month temporary employment is up then to hire new ones in order to keep labor costs low.

To accomplish this part of our vision needs men and women with decision-making authority in their places of work. It needs men and women of character, who combine trustworthiness, courage and concern for

all stakeholders, but who are willing to be unpopular, to put their own advancement at risk in order to uphold the values of justice, righteousness, and strive for excellence in products and services in the marketplace.

Thus to go back to an earlier point, the BCBP's target group for evangelization is not rank-and-file people. The target group of the BCBP is those men and women now involved in business and the professions who occupy positions of responsibility of such a type that they can bring about changes in the culture of their own company and field of expertise.

The target group of the BCBP is not retired businessmen and professionals. This does not mean such people aren't loved by Christ or that they cannot make a contribution to Christ's work, but they are not the target group of the BCBP. A time will come when our members retire from active involvement in the business world and the professions. That fact changes nothing in their membership. It is our prayer that the BCBP can profit from their wisdom and expertise as long as the Lord gives them good health. They will always be loved and honored in the BCBP communities where they are, whether they can contribute actively or not.

The people we want to win for Christ in line with our vision and mission are men and women who are at this time in some kind of position of responsibility and are on their way up in their companies or professions. That is why we are looking for young executives of about 30 to 40 years of age. When I say this, I do not want to imply that we must not or should not win slightly older men for Christ or slightly younger men for Christ.

### **Summary**

To pull what was said above together: Our vision has two parts, the first part focuses on evangelization. This part of our vision we try to accomplish by evangelizing businessmen and women and professionals, who are young and are on the way up, but already occupy positions of responsibility in their companies. We evangelize through our breakfasts, the BCLP, and our basic formation program, which includes providing for new people competent and generous Action Group Leaders.

# GIMIKAMPS for BCBP Children

In 2001, BCBP Makati's Youth and Family Ministry created a novel forum through which members' children could feel part of the community. Coined from "gimmick," a youth term for a fun event, and "camping," which was to be its medium, GIMIKAMP was born, integrating games, team play and basic gospel themes in a tidy 3-day summer package.

GIMIKAMP gently pushed BCBP offspring beyond the usual Christmas parties, Anniversaries and Family Days, into more structured interaction and greater familiarity with each other. Given the chance to have fun, eat together, work on team building and bond with each other, erstwhile hesitant acquaintances and shy participants blossomed into tight friends who happened to understand a bit more of what took up their parents' Friday nights.

Taking-off was not an easy thing. One major hurdle – believe it – was parents. BCBP members reluctant to let go of their young ones

ranging in age from 9 through 20 "invaded" the camp, but the Service Team had a strict policy: "no parents allowed!" Although organizers had to battle a potential glut of mamas and papas, there were potential scarcities in other areas. It was sometimes difficult to have enough member-volunteers, as the camps ran from Thursdays through Sundays, but efforts were strong towards getting the single and younger members to help. In spite of full Governance Team support and consistent parental desire, cost was a concern, thus the need for sponsors and subsidies. Another resource that threatened shortage was food; each GIMIKAMP was populated by chewing machines, as every GIMIKAMP parent can attest!

Eight GIMIKAMPS and counting, BCBP Makati did get its annual youth program. In addition, sports-related activities have been organized: family badminton and basketball (a series of friendly games with BCBP Alabang). The children have also become increasingly involved in Makati's annual Works of Mercy activities and Eco-reach centers, getting up-close to the reality of life for the poor and the need for charity and compassion for the less advantaged. Outgoing Chapter Head Joey Avellana assesses the program: "GIMIKAMP has not only brought our children closer together, it has created special bonds among members. One might even say that it is our most potent way of evangelizing our families, when children realize that their parents have made a firm commitment to make BCBP's vision, mission and values a way of life."



To-date, seven GIMIKAMPers have become BCBP members with hardly any pressure from parent members! Now that they've reached adulthood, they want to experience for themselves the full life of BCBP membership, as witnessed from members who have served them all these years and from their own parents!"

Beth Ginete, a GIMIKAMP original, looks back to provide pointers for BCBP's Youth and Family Ministries: Know your chapter's children in order to prepare activities that can attract and bond them to BCBP. Have sincere, patient and loving parent/member volunteers to serve our youth. Evangelizing our children in any way is the best thing we can pass on to them, towards a life of faith and fellowship with fellow BCBP children.

And Joey looks forward. "One day soon, with GIMIKAMP, a revamped youth ministry and Family Encounter activities, BCBP Makati can look forward to having a full community and family life dedicated to Jesus Christ! Wouldn't that be something?" **K**
